EDIBLES

APPLES: (3 1/2' - 6' trees at purchase. Plant two trees for pollination. ME grown.)

- 0185 - **Crimson Beauty**, Z3-4. Summer. Extremely early medium-sized crisp juicy tart red fruit. Excellent for eating and cooking. **\$24.50ea.**
0216- **Duchess of Oldenburg**, Z3-4. Late Summer. Aroostook's favorite apple. Yellow firm medium size fruit. Best pie apple. **\$24.50ea.**
0260 - **Fameuse**, Z3-5. Early Fall. Flesh white, tender, juicy... deliciously pleasant. Excellent for eating, sauce and cider. **\$24.50ea.**
0266- **Fireside**, Z3-5. Winter. Very hardy, recommended for fresh eating -salads, sauce and baking. Very large light red fruit. **\$24.50ea.**
0386 - **Honeycrisp**, Z3-4. Winter. Cream-colored flesh is sweet and juicy with a hard snapping texture. Scab resistance. **\$24.50ea.**
0696 - **Pewaukee**, Z3-5. Fall-Winter. Medium-sized greenish-red fruit. Not a dessert fruit. Makes a smooth, tart applesauce. **\$24.50ea.**
0710 - **Pomme Grise**, Z3-5. Early Fall. Firm, crisp, juicy, rich, sub-acid and aromatic. Superb fresh eating. Still crunchy in January. **\$24.50ea.**
1017- **Sweet 16**, Z3-6. Early Fall. Medium-sized fruit. Fine-textured, crisp flesh. Sweet nutty and spicy flavor. Excellent fresh eating. **\$24.50ea.**
1214- **Yellow Transparent**, Z3-5. Summer. Heavy annual cropper of exceptionally early apples. White juicy flesh. **\$24.50ea.**

PEARS: (3 1/2' - 6' trees at purchase. Plant two varieties for pollination. ME grown.)

- 1523- **Golden Spice**, Z3. Fall. Good eating and canning. Yellow soft tender flesh is buttery, juicy and tart. Extremely hardy. **\$24.50ea.**
1582- **Patten**, Z3. Late Summer. Very good fresh eating with sweet "high flavor." A good pollinator for other varieties. **\$24.50ea.**
1615 - **Stacyville**, Z3. Late Summer. Medium-sized light-yellow fruit. Disease resistant, extremely hardy and very vigorous. **\$24.50ea.**
1620 - **Summercrisp**, Z3. Midsummer. Very sweet dessert and canning pear with green skin and a red blush. Ripens in August. **\$24.50ea.**

PIE CHERRIES: (3 1/2' - 6' trees at purchase. Self-pollinating. ME grown.)

- 1927- **Evans**, Z3. Mid-Late Summer. Excellent for eating, jams, jellies and pies. Makes dark red juice and wine. Naturally dwarf tree. **\$24.50ea.**
1933- **Mesabi**, Z3-4. Summer. A sour cherry. Recommended for sauce and pies. Heavy yielding and extremely hardy. **\$24.50ea.**

PLUMS: (3 1/2' - 6' trees at purchase. Self-pollinating, but 2 improve pollination rates. ME grown.)

- 2028- **American Plum Seedling**, Z3. Decent red, yellow and orange 1" fruit. Suitable for fresh eating. Plant 3-6' apart. **\$24.50ea.**
2064- **La Crescent**, Z3. Late Summer. Roundish tender thin-skinned yellow fruit blushed with pink. Juicy and sweet. **\$24.50ea.**
2075 - **Pembina**, Z3. Midsummer. Large pointy bright red fruit with bluish bloom. Golden-orange flesh is apricot flavored. **\$24.50ea.**
2149 - **Mount Royal**, Z3. Late Summer. Good fresh, dried, canned, frozen or in preserves. Abundant annual crop. **\$24.50ea.**
2180- **Stanly**, Z3. Late Summer. Firm, juicy, sweet flesh. Excellent for cooking, eating, canning and drying. **\$24.50ea.**

LOWBUSH BLUEBERRIES: (*Vaccinium angustifolium*, grow 6"x24", 2-year transplants. ME grown.)

- 2260- **Lowbush Blueberries**, Z2. The only true blueberry. Lustrous blue-green foliage in summer, bright colors in fall. **\$11.00 ea.**
Excellent for stabilizing soil on sandy banks.

HIGHBUSH BLUEBERRIES: (12"x30", 2-year transplants. Plant 2 varieties for pollination. ME grown.)

- 2325- **Northland**, Z3. Early. Medium-sized berries. Very vigorous and productive. Has limber branches that tolerate snow well. **\$12.50 ea.**
2335- **Patriot**, Z3. Early-Mid. Large berries with good color and flavor. Adaptable to many soil types. **\$12.50 ea.**

GRAPES: (1- 2-year transplants. Plant 2 varieties for pollination. ME grown.)

- 2370- **Beta**, Z3. Medium-sized black berries. Excellent for juice, jelly, jam or ripe off the vine. Vigorous and hardy. **\$11.00 ea.**
2380- **Bluebell**, Z3. Delicious sweet flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, jelly and juice. Extremely hardy. **\$11.00 ea.**
2465- **Marquette**, Z3. Extremely hardy. Great for pinot noir- style table wine. Small-medium size berries and clusters. **\$11.00 ea.**

RASPBERRIES: (Second variety not needed for pollination.)

- 2660- **Killarney**, Z3. Summer bearing. Yields consistently. Extremely hardy. **Bundle of 10/\$22.00**
2685- **Nova**, Z3. Mid. Bright red fruit with minimally spiny canes so its easy to pick. Productive and hardy. **Bundle of 10/\$22.00**
2690- **Prelude**, Z3. Early. Best berry for early-season fresh eating. Great taste, medium-sized fruit. **Bundle of 10/\$22.00**

BLACKBERRIES: (Second variety not needed for pollination.)

- 2751- **Nelson's Blackberry**, Z3-4. Midsummer. Moderately large juicy fruit. True blackberry taste. High productivity. **Bundle of 3/\$16.00**

STRAWBERRIES: (50 plants will plant from 50'-100', virus free, bare-root stock.)

- 2770- **Earlglow**, Z3. Early berry with excellent flavor. Great for fresh eating and freezing. **Bundle of 50/\$15.00**
2775- **Honeoye**, Z3-4. Early-Mid. Large bright red fruit. Firm flesh with good tart flavor. Plant in well-drained soil. **Bundle of 50/\$15.00**
2790- **Sparkle**, Z3. This is the perfect strawberry. Delicious fresh eating, excellent for jams and freezing. **Bundle of 50/\$15.00**

RHUBARB: (Plant with a bushel of well-rotted manure and compost, and sidedress with manure every spring.)

- 2880- **MacDonald**, Z3. Early. Most famous for pies and wines. Also great for sauce, breads and juice. **Bundle of 2/\$15.00**

CONIFERS

- 3270- **Balsam Fir**, Z3. the most abundant conifer in Maine, this Maine grown tree is a favorite not only of songbirds, but moose and deer as well. Semi-shade tolerant and slow growing, prefers well drained, moist, acid soils. (Size 45x75") 6-12" transplant **5/\$15.50**
- 3400- **Norway Spruce**, Z2. Fast growing. Bright green foliage. Excellent lumber. Showy (marketable) 4-6" cones. Pendulous habit. (Size 80") 9-18" transplant **5/\$15.50**
- 3420- **Colorado Blue Spruce**, Z2. Truer blue foliage than other cultivars. Can be used as a screen. Not for wet soils. (Size 30x60") 9-18" transplant **5/\$15.50**
- 3590- **Eastern White Cedar**, Z2. Slow growing. Valuable light fragrant wood. Good for screens and hedges. (Size 20x60") 9-18" transplant **5/\$15.50**

SHADE TREES

- 3985- **Red Maple**, Z3. Also called Swamp Maple, famous for electric orange, yellow and red foliage in the fall. Sometimes tapped for sap in the spring. Transplants easily. (Size: 50x60") 3-4' transplant **\$18.00 ea.**
- 3990- **Sugar Maple**, Z3. Also called Rock Maple, valued for shade, syrup and lumber. Has yellow and crimson fall foliage. Shade tolerant making it easy to interplant in existing woods. (Size 50x100") 3-4' transplant **\$18.00 ea.**
- 4006- **Yellow Birch**, Z3. Has deep dark golden-yellow shredding exfoliating bark that glows and dazzles in the woods. Yellow fall color. Very hard dense high-quality wood. Makes beautiful flooring too. (Size 75x50") 4-5' transplant **\$16.00 ea.**
- 4009- **Sweet Birch**, Z3. Medium-sized tree with a rounded irregular wide-spreading crown. Foliage turns golden yellow in the fall. This is the birch to use for your birch beer, which is brewed from the sap. Brew a wintergreen tea from its twigs and leaves too. (Size 60x45") 3-5' transplant **\$18.00 ea.**
- 4135- **Amur Chokecherry**, Z2. Extremely hardy. Spreading rounded tree with year-round interest. White flowers in 2-3" long racemes in mid-spring. Bark varies from golden brown to dark. Red-black berries in mid-summer relished by birds and suitable for jelly, juice and wine. (Size 20x40") 4-5' transplant **\$16.00 ea.**
- 4145- **White Oak**, Z3. Great ornamental tree for a large yard. Bark is finely grooved and etched. Wood is valued for lumber and firewood. Edible acorns attract a variety of wildlife. Disease and insect resistant. (Size 80x80") 2-4' transplant **\$18.00 ea.**
- 4150 - **Bicolor Oak**, Z3. Dawns large, glossy, dark-green, leathery, lobed-leaves with a grayish-green hairy felt underside. Large acorns are attractive to wildlife, particularly waterfowl. Has yellow to reddish-purple fall color. Very fast growing once established. (Size 60x60") 24-30" transplant **\$16.00 ea.**
- 4205- **American Linden**, Z3. or Basswood. Tall tree with rounded crown. Attracts bees with sweetly fragrant yellow June flowers. Great soft carving wood. Young fruit and flowers can be ground into a paste for a chocolate substitute. (Size 60x80") 2-3" transplant **\$15.00 ea.**

ORNAMENTAL TREES

- 4245- **White Fringe Tree**, Z3. Lacy white fragrant flower clusters in the spring. Beautiful dark green foliage. Bluish-black fruit attract birds. (Size: 30x30") 2-3' transplant **\$18.00 ea.**
- 4255- **Pagoda Dogwood**, Z3. Small tree or large multi-stemmed shrub with fragrant white flower clusters in mid/late spring. Dark blue berries in mid-summer. Berries eaten by birds and other wildlife. Leaves reddish-purple in fall. (Size 20x35") 12-30" transplant **\$13.50 ea.**
- 4912- **Japanese Tree Lilac**, Z3. Vibrant, bright, showy, white flowers. Each made of countless 4-petaled flowers. Reddish-brown cherry like bark. Beautiful as a specimen or in groups. Resistant to lilac borers and powdery mildew. (Size 20x25") 24-48" transplant **\$17.00 ea.**

FLOWERING CRABAPPLES: (3 1/2- 6' trees at purchase. Will pollinate other apples. ME grown).

- 4575- **Dolgo**, Z2. Pink buds with large white fragrant flowers. Fruit good for jellies and canning. (Size 25x30") **\$24.00 ea.**
- 4645- **Kerr**, Z2-3. Large fruited crab with a multitude of uses. Heavy annual bloom of white flowers in summer. Deep red fruit are decent for eating raw off the tree. (Size 20x24") **\$24.00 ea.**

ORNAMENTAL SHRUBS

- 2915- **Serviceberry**, Z2. Fragrant white flowers bloom in early spring. Berries are good in pies, cobblers, jellies, jams and cakes. Popular with wildlife. Nice red-orange fall color. Two plants are recommended for good pollination. (Size 5x10") 18-24" transplant **\$16.00 ea.**
- 3238- **'Regal' Lingonberry**, Z3. Bright glossy red nutritious fruit make good sauces, jams, syrups, juices and wines. Small shiny dark foliage. Each mature plant will produce over 2 pounds. Ripens in late summer best after a frost. Stores up to 2 months in fridge. (Size 8x36") small 1 year transplant **\$12.00 ea.**
- 4968- **Black Chokeberry**, Z3. Showy white blooms in spring, glossy green foliage turns bright red in fall. Edible fruit great for juice or jelly and attracts birds. An excellent alternative to the aggressive burning bush. (Size 4x6") 12-30" transplant **\$11.00 ea.**
- 5069- **Sweet Pepperbush**, Z3. Red buds and beautiful spires of heavenly scented deep-pink flowers appear on racemes for 6 weeks in mid-summer. Bees and butterflies love it, but rabbits and deer do not. Dark green foliage turns deep gold in fall. (Size 4-5") 10-24" transplant **\$13.00 ea.**
- 3245- **Highbush Cranberry**, Z2. Has a cluster of white flowers in May. Brilliant red-orange berries from September to February. Berries can be used for jams and preserves and are very popular with dozens of bird species. (Size 8-12") 9-12" transplant **\$12.00 ea.**

ORNAMENTAL SHRUBS continued...

- 5240- Bayberry**, Z2-3. A very salt tolerant shrub. Small grayish-blue waxy berries produced on female plants are highly fragrant historically used to make candles. Plants feed numerous wildlife species. Excellent in masses or hedges. Include at least one male plant to ensure pollination. **\$14.00 ea.**
(Size 5-9') 12-24" transplant
- 5720- White Snowberry**, Z3. Broad rounded wildlife shrub. Medium rippled-edged blue-green foliage. Excellent for holding soil on a steep, shady, moist bank. Provides good wildlife forage and cover at the same time. 1/2" whitish berries which persist until the birds get them. Easy to transplant. **\$12.00 ea.**
(Size 5x6') 12-18" transplant
- 5267- Blizzard Mockorange**, Z3. A "blizzard" of fragrant pure-white slightly cupped 4-petal blossoms for up to 4 weeks in late spring after the lilacs fade. Prune after flowering. **\$14.00 ea.**
(Size 4-3') 18-32" transplant
- 5921- Witherod Viburnum**, Z3. Rounded dense native shrub. Creamy-white flowers in 2-5" cymes bloom from late spring to into early summer. Highly desired for its multicolored edible fruit which turns from green to pink to blue before turning black in the fall. Good for naturalizing. **\$15.00 ea.**
(Size 5x6') 9-12" transplant
- 5142- Northern Gold Forsythia**, Z3. Outstanding bud hardiness. Beautiful golden-yellow flowers with rich green foliage. **\$14.00 ea.**
(Size 6x7') 9-18" transplant
- 5958- Carnival Weigela**, Z3. Compact dense rounded shrub. Amazing multi-colored, red-pink-white, tubular, funnel-shaped azalea-like flowers. Attracts hummingbirds. Forest green foliage with yellow fall color. **\$15.00 ea.**
(Size 4x5') 12-18" transplant
- HAZELNUT:**
- 3799- Precocious Hazelbert**, Z4. Vigorous suckering plant takes 3-4 years to bear. Medium sized nut. Plant 2 for pollination. **\$19.00 ea.**
(Size 12x12') 24-36" transplant
- HYDRANGEA:**
- 5168- 'Annabelle' Hydrangea**, Z3. Upright rounded shrub. Large clusters of 1" white flowers bloom from June till September. Grows fast. Big 5-6" almost heart shaped foliage. **\$16.00 ea.**
(Size 3x5') medium plant
- 5182- 'Limelight' Hydrangea**, Z3. Large (6-12") upright very creamy-white flowers turn lime-green in August and then a pale rose in fall. Blooms on new wood. Dark green foliage. **\$18.00 ea.**
(Size 6-8') 6-12" transplant
- 5184- Late Panicle Hydrangea**, Z3. Blooms July-September. Creamy-white lacy pointed panicles, turn pinkish on edges-almost purple-red and provide long lasting blooms. Flowers on new wood. **\$18.00 ea.**
(Size 10x10') 2-3" transplant
- POTENTILLA:** (*Potentilla fruticosa*. Also called Shrubby Cinquefoil or Widdy. Unbelievably hardy. Z2. ME grown.)
- 5288- 'Abbotswood' Potentilla**, Z2. Prolific, pure-white single-flowers with light-yellow stamens. Flowers early July. **\$12.00 ea.**
(Size 2x3') 18-24" transplant
- 5306- 'Mango Tango' Potentilla**, Z2. Unusual tri-color orange, red and yellow blooms. Bright-green foliage. **\$12.00 ea.**
(Size 2x2') 6-12" transplant
- 5312- 'Pink Beauty' Potentilla**, Z2. Soft-pink petals edged in fainter pink. Pink Beauty holds it's color very well. **\$12.00 ea.**
(Size 3x3') 12-20" transplant
- 5314- 'Primrose Beauty' Potentilla**, Z2. Faint yellow flowers with a slightly deeper-yellow center. Color appears creamy from a distance. **\$12.00 ea.**
(Size 3x3') 18-24" transplant
- ROSE:** (*Rosa*. Hardy, vigorous, disease, pest resistant and significantly easier to grow than most named varieties. Rugged, hard to kill. These roses make beautiful hedges. All roses are stocky well rotted plants, cut back to about 6" to encourage optimal growth and bloom.)
- 5350- 'Rugosa' Rose**, Z2. Also called Beach Rose. Vigorous shrub with flowers ranging from deep pink to white. **Bundle of 3/\$18.50**
Red hips are great for making jams and teas and can even be eaten fresh as a good source of vitamin C. Tolerates salt, pollution and drought. **\$18.50 ea.**
(Size 4x6') 12-18" transplant
- 5424- 'Hansa' Rose**, Z3. Large 3" very fragrant full purplish-red flowers bloom in early summer with re-bloom in fall. Glossy, dark-green, disease-free foliage; turns yellow-orange in fall. **\$13.00 ea.**
(Size 7x7') 12-18" transplant
- 5442- 'Hope For Humanity' Rose**, Z3. Double cupped flowers resemble tea roses. Wine-red buds "blood" -red blossoms. Light fragrance. **\$13.00 ea.**
(Size 5x5') 12-18" transplant
- 5500- 'Purple Pavement' Rose**, Z3. Bright purplish flowers with golden stamens can look lavender-mauve. Strong spicy sweet fragrance. Yellow-maroon fall color. **\$13.00 ea.**
(Size 4x4') 12-18" transplant
- 5544- 'William Baffin' Rose**, Z3. Prolific semi-double 2-3" deep-pink flowers with bright yellow stamens bloom all summer. Arching long flexible canes are suitable for a tall hedge or arbor. **\$13.00 ea.**
(Size 8x10') 12-18" transplant
- LILAC:** (*Syringa*. Excellent alone or in hedges. Deep green, glossy heart-shaped foliage looks good from spring through fall, intensely fragrant blooms in June over a period of weeks. Large 2-3 year old transplants).
- 5741- 'Asessippi' Lilac**, Z3. Faint light-purple with bright pink 3 1/2 panicles. Flowers even on lower branches. **\$15.00 ea.**
(Size 8x10') Large transplant
- 5777- 'Miss Kim' Lilac**, Z3. Heavily scented extremely prolific small single ice-blue lavender blooms. Small dark green foliage. Compact rounded form. **\$15.00 ea.**
(Size 8x8') Large transplant
- 5801- 'Common Purple' Lilac**, Z2. The true old-fashioned Lilac and best for a spreading hedge. (Size 12x15') Large transplant **\$15.00 ea.**
- 5840- 'Ludwig Spaeth' Lilac**, Z3. Deep rich flowers. Dark magnificent purple color. An excellent hedge plant, suckers profusely. **\$15.00 ea.**
